#### • DIVERSION

Creates diversion program for workers charged with 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> offenses

## • FINES FOR BUYERS

Fines an additional 1000 dollars to buyers soliciting.

#### REDISTRIBUTION

Creates grant funds and awarding body to redistribute those funds.

#### • CRIME CREATION

Creates a new crime of loitering misdemeanor for buyers.


### Clement 1 AB379

require a person who commits prostitution with the intent to eceive compensation, money, or anything of value from another person to, for a first or 2nd violation of those provisions, be offered a diversion program pursuant to specified provisions.


#### Clement 2 AB379

The bill would make it a misdemeanor for any person to loiter in any public place with the intent to purchase commercial sex, as specified. The bill would make any person who violates that crime or who commits prostitution n exchange for providing compensation money, or anything of value to the other person subject to an additional fine of **\$1,000**,





Clement 3 AB379 would establish the Survivor Support Fund and require that additional fines be deposited in the fund. The bill would require the California Victim Compensation Board to establish a grant program to provide grants to community-based organizations that provide direct services and outreach to victims of sex trafficking and exploitation




## Element 4 AB379

and would, upon appropriation by the Legislature, authorize moneys in the Survivor Support Fund to be used for the purposes of that grant program.





### Element 5 AB379



#### SUMMARY

Creates a licensure program for peer mental health providers.

#### • LIVED EXPERIENCE

Centers Lived Experience as a valid qualifier to work in the field. Centers lived experience experts as best suited to respond to our community.

#### EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITY

Solves a workforcevelopment problem for the state by providing more work ready people with opportunities to serve.

#### • REDUCES HARM

Lived experience experts will help with medication management reminders, peer support for recovery services, access to scheduling appointments, arriving to, and attending appointments, and an array of other services.

### **PMHA Bill**

Peer Mental Health Advocates (PMHA) are a critical, albeit missing component of services within California Infrastructure. California Hospital Infrastructure already had under Dr Chambers at Dignity Health a Survivor Advocate to oversee the implementation, identification, and support of victims experiencing trafficking in persons. A PMHA are not only people who use their experiences of recovery and healing to help others in recovery — peer support means using experiences of mental illness to support others who are struggling, or in need of support.

#### • JUVENILE IMMUNITY

Currently post conviction relief creates an affirmative defense to have records relief after the fact. Immunity is presentencing to avoid the harm of incarceration altogether.

#### MISSION

Keep jurisdiction of crimes committed by workers in the sex industry and child under 18 trafficking survivors to the juvenile courts and implement a non prosecution policy for crimes commonly affiliated with the sex industry.

#### VALUES

Youth and children shouldn't be incarcerated and experience irreparable harm/trauma for defending themselves in the sex trade or simply surviving.


#### VISION


Pre-filing diversion program for youth under 18 experiencing the sex trade in any capacity to have charges diverted.



#### **Handouts**

 Prepare one pagers with citations for facts about what you are opposing or supporting. Train the people you are advocating with on the materials. Make it easy for people to sign on and support.

## Tips 4 -- POLICY

#### Planning

 Prepare for meetings and map out who you want to work with, who can champion your legislation both with legislators and organizations.
 Introduce the bill in both the house and senate.

#### **Analysis**

 Break down the legislation chunk by chunk into main points and have definitive reasons why it's harmful or helpful.

#### Revision

 Be prepared to make concessions and be strategic about what those concessions may be and may not be.

#### Collaboration

 Build collaboration with other movements and leaders to support your work. Don't do the work alone and find a team of people to support and insulate you frpm harm

#### Presentation

 Be prepared to testify in formal hearings. Build relationships with allies who can share platform like professors, reearchers, and lawyers. Have a succinct 2-3 minute spiel, 10 minutes, and 20-30 minutes for different settings.

## Take action!

Schedule meetings with legislators, join meetings that are already existing, testify at hearings, draft better solutions that current legislation
