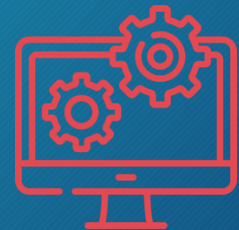

Radical Hospitality

- Existing tourism models often exploit workers and ignore safety
- Stigma prevents workers from shaping the policies that directly impact them
- Wellness industries profit from intimacy but exclude the people who have mastered it
- Tourism demand for erotic services is rising, but safety and economic justice frameworks lag
- Communities can benefit economically, culturally, and socially when erotic laborers lead design
